### Veterans Housing Options Group (VHOG)

Come learn about the various housing programs and opportunities from VA Puget Sound, Washington State Department of Veterans Affairs, Kitsap County Veterans Program, Supportive Services for Veteran Families, and Kitsap Community Resources Housing Solutions Center. ### Housing Solutions Center

The Housing Solutions Center (HSC) of Kitsap County offers individuals and families who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless a one-stop location to access all forms of housing assistance including emergency shelters, rental & deposit assistance, as well as landlord referrals. All housing referrals will be subject to the availability of the desired resources in the community. Call 360-473-2035

### Veterans Assistance Fund

Kitsap Community Resources (KCR) operates the Veterans Assistance Fund Program under contract with the Kitsap County. The fund provides eligible veterans and/or immediate family members with emergency financial assistance.

Temporary emergency assistance is available for:

- ◆ Rental, energy, and utilities assistance
- ◆ Assistance with food, transportation, medical & prescription costs, and many other needs.

### WDVA Transitional Housing Program

The WDVA Transitional Housing Program (THP) provides wrap-around services to veterans experiencing homelessness. A total of 130 beds are provided between two separate locations, in Port Orchard, and Orting WA. Building 10 is located on the grounds with Washington Veterans Home – RETSIL, in Port Orchard. Roosevelt Barracks, & Betsy Ross House are located on the grounds with Washington Soldiers Home in Orting WA.

The program is designed to assist homeless veterans in need of stable housing, vocational rehabilitation, and increased income potential. Supportive staff assist veterans to engage with services and achieve a goal of greater self-determination and housing stability. Link to video about the program:

## U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs Programs for Veterans Housing

- ◆ Veterans who are homeless or at imminent risk of becoming homeless can call or visit their local VA Medical Center or Community Resource and Referral Center where VA staff are ready to help.
- ◆ Veterans and their families may also call 1-877-4AID-VET (1-877-424-3838) to access VA services.

## Homeless Veteran Community Employment Services (HVCES)

- ◆ Employment is a key element in helping Veterans' transition permanently out of homelessness or avoid it altogether. The HVCES program makes it easier than ever for business and industry to find, interview and hire job-ready Veterans exiting homelessness.
- ◆ Through this program, VA has deployed more than 150 Community Employment Coordinators (CECs), based at most VA Medical Centers across the country, to collaborate with employers ready to hire Veterans exiting homelessness. CECs are recruiters' connection to potential Veteran new hires for jobs in a wide variety of sectors.

## Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF)

- ◆ SSVF provides case management & supportive services to prevent the imminent loss of a Veteran's home or identify a new, more suitable housing situation for the individual and his or her family; or to rapidly re-house Veterans & their families who are homeless and might remain homeless without this assistance.

## U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development-VA Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH)

- ◆ This collaborative program between HUD and VA combines HUD housing vouchers with VA supportive services to help Veterans who are homeless, and their families find and sustain permanent housing. As of Sept. 30, 2015, HUD had allocated more than 78,000 vouchers to help house Veterans across the country. Connect via a referral from Kitsap Community Resources - Housing Solutions Center (HSC).

## Vocational Readiness and Employment (VR&E)

- ◆ VR&E helps Veterans and Service members with service-connected disabilities and employment barriers prepare for, find and maintain suitable careers. For Veterans and Service members with service-connected disabilities so severe that they cannot immediately consider work, VR&E offers services to improve their ability to live as independently as possible.
