

The County has made our project a priority to expedite permits.


September 5, 2023, 0800 was move-out date of Fire Station 51. Clark Construction- Monday, September 18, 2023, 0800.




Data Analytics-Data Poor to Data Smart Dashboard of performance at the 90th%
