- Race Forward (Organization that runs the Government Alliance for Racial Equity) The trainings they offer include Building Racial Equity (Level 1), Organizing Racial Equity (Level 2), and Decision-Making for Racial Equity (Level 3).
- **Race Equity Institute** They developed the Groundwater Approach to understanding equity, which is a really useful framework, especially for government. Excellent training for governmental agencies. ACLU WA recommends them.
- People's Institute for Survival and Beyond Their *Undoing Racism* workshops (a three-day training) have excellent content. No slides or set agenda and they are very up front about white supremacy and anti-blackness. Some of the content may be triggering, especially for individuals of color, who are asked to reflect and share some sensitive information. Equity managers reported that they heard from some of their POC staff say that they wished they were forewarned about the content.
- **Equity in the Center** They provide some trainings specifically for white people and others for people of color. Their equity stances course is excellent and affordable. They have a model for building a race equity culture called *Awake to Woke*.
- **Huayruro** Offers great white ally training and deep introspection restorative practice training. Reasonably priced and based in Seattle.
- Cultures Connecting: Addressing Race Relations in the 21st Century. This firm located in Renton WA and offers facilitation, consulting, coaching, keynote services, and workshops. This firm has done loads and loads of work in the Puget Sound region, especially for City of Seattle, and are recognized as a national and state leader. They have a wonderful book on How to Facilitate Conversations on Race. Their co-founder Caprice Hollins did an excellent recent TEDX talk and co-founder Ilsa Govan co-wrote an excellent book with Tillman Smith, What's Up With White Women. They have recordings of trainings focused on helping white women in their anti-oppression work that can be found here.
- **Racing Equity** They have a Transformational Leadership Institute and provide discounts and scholarships for BIPOC registrants.
- **Hooks Global** Founder, Karena Hooks, is based in the Puget Sound area. They offer a variety of training including *50 Shades of Anti-Blackness*.

Leadership Snohomish offers equity training annually.

Seventh Sovereign offers training to organizations that work with tribes. The Washington State Department of Commerce has contracted with them in the past.
