



# **How to Participate**



Not sure if your weeds are noxious? Find the latest Kitsap County Noxious Weed List on our website at kcowa.us/noxiousweeds.

Let facility attendants know that you have noxious weeds to dispose of.

Provide some information including: Name, Phone Number or Email, Noxious Weed Species, and Address of the property the weeds were removed from.



### Participating Facilities

#### **Olympic View Transfer Station**

Hard hat and high visibility vest required for mechanical tipping

# Hansville, Olalla, and Silverdale Garbage & Recycling Facilities and Bainbridge Disposal

- Limit to one standard pickup load (8' bed) or less per day, per property
- Hand unload only

These facilities have the right to turn loads away if capacity is reaching its

maximum for the day



#### Remember to secure your load!

Bagged or loose, your load should be secured by tarp or net, or be subject to a \$10 unsecured load fee. This is especially important to prevent the spread of noxious weeds as they are moved from your property to the disposal facilities.

# Landowner Reimbursement Program

- Build process into our Integrated Pest Management Policy (Committee?)
- Would likely become primary program expenditure
- > Need to prioritize species, land types, and other factors to determine how to distribute funds
- Potential starting point:

Class B (D)	50%	2
Class B (ND)	25%	3

# Long Lake - Invasive Aquatic Vegetation Management Plan

- Efforts to control invasives in the lake ongoing ince/1970s
  - Eurasian watermilfoil Class B Designate
  - Brazilian elodea Class B, Non-Designate
  - Fragrant waterlily Class C
  - Curly leaf pondweed Class C
- > Lake management district secured Dept. of Ecology grant to fund IAVMP; completed in 2022
- > Additional Ecology grant awarded to treat invasives based on IAVMP; 2023-2025 grant cycle
- > 25% from Kitsap County (Noxious Weed Fund/Coordinator time), 75% from Ecology, \$100,000 total
- > Contractor AquaTechnex was selected during RFP process to conduct treatment this summer

### County Roads

- > Roads crews conduct annual broadcast spray of roadsides; divided into "areas"
- Most county road rights-of-way are essentially easements; county has right to utilize as needed for transportation infrastructure, but landowner retains responsibility of unused right-of-way
- > Previous Noxious Weed Program spot treated weeds and billed roads, up to \$20,000 annually
- On-call contract may be best way to move forward; provides consistent contact(s) roads can call on to tackle infestations that make it past broadcast sprays
- > May need to emphasize education on landowner responsibility and rights-of-way

### Public Interaction

- > Roughly 50 individual reports to date in 2024, via phone, email, or See Click Fix
- > Handful of site visits to confirm species and assist in management plan
- > Top species include:
  - Knotweed
  - Blackberry
  - Scotch broom
  - Ivy
  - Holly
  - Poison Hemlock
  - Garlic mustard (only a few, but this is Class A)
- > Continuing to track and monitor, provide information and resources

Additional Summer Meetings to Work on Program Development

- > Integrated Pest Management Policy Committee
  - > Species priorities
  - > Standardized plans for dealing with weeds in various jurisdictions
  - > Details of reimbursement program
