

Overview

Kaiser Permanente's acquisition of Group Health Cooperative became final on Feb. 1, 2017. This means that Group Health is now a part of Kaiser Permanente and the more than 651,000 Group Health members in the state of Washington are now part of Kaiser Permanente's eighth and newest region in the United States. With the acquisition, Kaiser Permanente now serves more than 11 million members in eight states and the District of Columbia.

The acquisition extends Kaiser Permanente's award-winning model of coordinated care and coverage into Washington. By investing in facilities, technology, equipment, and people, Kaiser Permanente plans to improve affordability, quality, and service for members and the overall health of the community.

- 1. Becoming part of Kaiser Permanente does not change the 2017 plan or benefits Group Health members selected during their most recent Open Enrollment period.
- 2. The acquisition does not affect 2017 premiums, benefits or cost shares.
- 3. You can continue to see the doctors and care teams you count on.
- 4. You can continue to receive care at the same locations and hospitals you did before the acquisition.
- 5. Kaiser Permanente is investing in member experience, including upgrades to clinics, technology, access and more.

5 improvements to look forward to

- 1. A new Kaiser Permanente Burien Medical Center in the fall of 2017.
- 2. Upgrades to medical offices, equipment, and plans to increase capacity at Kaiser Permanente facilities.
- 3. Investments in IT infrastructure that will streamline and speed member care and access.
- 4. New walk-in clinics at Port Orchard, Tacoma, and Puyallup medical offices to increase same-day access to care.
- 5. Five new CareClinics are opening in Des Moines, Silver Lake, Gig Harbor, Snoqualmie, and Redmond Town Center boosting the number of convenient, quick, walk-in CareClinics from 10 to 15.
