This Contract between the State of Washington Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) and the Contractor is hereby amended as follows:

- **1.** Exhibit B, Budget, is revised and replaced by Exhibit B-1, Budget, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- 2. The total maximum consideration is increased by **\$2,260,085** (Case Management and Core Services Contract Management) for a new maximum consideration of **\$4,373,188**.
- **3.** Special Terms and Conditions, Section **4**. b, is revised to read:
  - b. **Payment.** Payment for **Medicaid Case Management and Nursing Services**, including Medicaid State plan, Waiver, Roads to Community Living (RCL), and state-funded Chore clients will be based on a monthly rate of **\$242.03** from DSHS Allocated Title XIX/Chore funding per month for each inhome agency personal care or in-home individual provider authorized case authorized by the AAA each month.

In addition, a percentage of in-home cases authorized with a service, but no personal care, will be paid at the full unit rate. (The percentage will be noted on the SFY24 TXIX Case Management billing form and SFY24 TXIX Matched Case Management billing form, and may be adjusted at ALTSA's discretion).

DSHS and the AAA recognize that we are balancing multiple changing factors that impact both caseload and workforce due to the nationwide workforce crisis and the impacts of coming out of the extended pandemic, as well as implementing a statewide Paid Medical Leave program. Any AAA whose clinical ratio is above 75:1 at the beginning of this contract will provide an updated written plan by August 1, 2023 of how they will come into compliance. The AAA may present good cause reasons and supporting data why they were not able to reach their target in SFY23, such as staffing turnover, accepting a surge of transfers or other unforeseen circumstances and their plan to reach their target each quarter. If the AAA has difficulty reaching or maintaining the ratio, the AAA and DSHS will mutually work to update the written staffing plan and resolve any conditions that cause case ratios to rise above 75:1. When a rise in average clinical caseload is due to the AAA accepting a higher than typical number of client transfers, there will be no concerns from DSHS while the AAA makes good faith effort to recruit and hire new staff.

As the legislature has funded all AAAs to staff on average a maximum of 75 clients to each clinical staff, in SFY25, beginning July 1, 2024, the CM/NS Unit Rate payment may, at DSHS' discretion, be adjusted monthly if the contractually obligated caseload ratio of clients to clinical (Case Management/Nursing staff) exceeds 75:1.

a. Payment for **Core Services Contract Management** for Medicaid State Plan, Waiver, Roads to Community Living (RCL)/WA Roads, and state-funded Chore clients will be based on a monthly rate of **\$16.01** from DSHS Allocated Title XIX/Chore funding per month for each in-home agency personal care or in-home individual provider case authorized to the AAA each month. In addition, a percentage of in-home cases authorized with a service, but no personal care, will be paid at the full unit rate.

The average monthly projection of such cases over the course of this Agreement is **1,019**. The AAA will be paid for the number of actual cases authorized each month according to the payment schedule above.

If the AAA is referred and serves a WA Roads or GOSH case that is not otherwise counted in the DSHS Central Contract Services Page 2 6024PF Contract Amendment (1-26-2018)

caseload above, payment will be based on the same monthly rates as above. These cases will be considered in the clinical caseload ratio.

If ADS or Pierce meet their quarterly targeted net growth of New Freedom cases as described in section 1.g of Exhibit A Statement of Work, they will receive a Unit Rate enhancement of 5% for all New Freedom client cases billed during that quarter. This funding will not be reflected in the contract budget or maximum consideration.

Payment shall be considered timely if made by DSHS within thirty (30) days after receipt and acceptance by DSHS of the properly completed invoices. Payment shall be sent to the address designated by the AAA on page one (1) of this Agreement. DSHS may, at its sole discretion, withhold payment claimed by the AAA for services rendered if AAA fails to satisfactorily comply with any term or condition of this Agreement.

DSHS shall not make any payments in advance or anticipation of the delivery of services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement. Unless otherwise specified in this Agreement, DSHS shall not pay any claims for payment for services submitted more than 6 months after completion of the contract period. The AAA shall not bill DSHS for services performed under this Agreement, and DSHS shall not pay the AAA, if the AAA has charged or will charge the State of Washington or any other party under any other contract or agreement for the same services.

4. The following is added to the end of Exhibit A, Section 1.d:

The initial contract budget and maximum consideration will reflect 12-month funding for all programs except Medicaid Case Management/Nursing Services. That program will be funded for 3 months initially, with a contract amendment expected in August 2023. The full funding amendment, while executed early in good faith, is contingent upon the case transfer agreement described in SOW 1 (d). The rates in the amendment are applied for invoices for all service months of the contract period.

All other terms and conditions of this Contract remain in full force and effect.
