

#### **A A A** A ...

<u>Acute Illness</u>—An illness that has occurred suddenly and may be serious.

<u>Activities of Daily Living (ADL)</u>—Behaviors necessary for self care. <u>Adaptive Behavior</u>—Use of basic skills in daily life activities.

Adult Service Agency—Federal, state or locally funded agency (with written policies and procedures) that provides services to adults and children (i.e., Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD); Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR); Public Assistance (Welfare); Women, Infants and Children (WIC); Employment Security, etc.).

<u>Ambulatory Care</u>—Health services that are provided without an overnight stay in a health-care facility.

<u>Ancillary Services</u>—Miscellaneous tests, such as laboratory or radiological exams.

<u>Assistive Technology Device</u>—Any item or piece of equipment that is useful to increase, maintain, or improve abilities of individuals with disabilities.

#### ВВВв...

- Basic Health Plan (BHP)—Managed care plan available through the State of Washington to any individual or family. Premiums can be subsidized by the state, based on income and need.
- <u>Basic Health Plan/Plus (BHP/Plus)</u>—Basic Health Plan for eligible children that provides its benefits through Healthy Options/ Medicaid.

#### **C C C c** ...

<u>Case Management</u>—The process of having a person's health-care needs coordinated by using an ongoing plan.

- <u>Case Manager</u>—Individual who arranges services, ensures that clients progress through the process, completes reviews, and (may) maintain fiscal responsibility.
- <u>Coinsurance</u>—A percentage (often 20%) that an insured person pays for a visit to a physician or other health care provider, a hospital stay or treatment.
- <u>Community Based Programs</u>—Programs for individuals with disabilities that are located within the individual's community.
- <u>Community Resources</u>—Public or private agencies, schools or programs offering services to people.
- <u>Concurrent Review</u>—A review by an insurer at the time of service to verify that a patient needs continued inpatient care.
- <u>Copayment</u>—A fixed dollar amount the recipient pays for health-care services at the time of receiving the service.
- <u>Curricullum-Based Vocational Assessment (CBVA)</u>—Various tests to determine the career development and vocational instruction needs of students based on preferences in course content and curriculum; identification of students' career/vocational strengths and weaknesses.

#### **D D D D** ...

<u>Deductible</u>—The amount of money an insured person pays for services before the insurer starts paying the bill.

Diagnosis—Identification of a disease producing a specific condition.

- <u>Diagnostic Services</u>—Procedures to determine the presence of a health condition.
- <u>Durable Medical Equipment (DME)</u>—A long-lasting medical supply, such as a wheelchair.

#### ΕΕΕΕ...

- <u>Elective Procedure</u>—A procedure that isn't an emergency and that a patient and doctor plan in advance.
- <u>Emergency</u>—An injury or acute medical condition likely to cause death, disability, or serious illness if not attended to very quickly.
- <u>Employability</u>—Factors that determine whether an individual can be placed on a job and whether the individual can keep the job

once placed.

Exclusions—Health conditions that an insurance policy specifically doesn't cover.

#### FFFF...

<u>Functional Living Skills Assessment</u>—Skills, interests, and values related to functioning in the home and community.

**G G G G** ...

- <u>Gainful Employment</u>—Includes employment in one of the following: Competitive labor market, supported employment, sheltered employment, or homebound work. Work is performed for living wage and typical benefits.
- <u>Gatekeeper</u>—The person who controls a patient's access to healthcare services, whether as a case manager or a primary-care provider. Typically, this person must approve all uses of health-care services.

<u>Habilitation</u>—Services provided to individual with developmental disabilities to help them achieve the highest level of

<u>Healthcare for Workers with Disabilities (HWD)</u>—Medicaid buy-in program for workers with disabilites

- <u>Health Maintenance Organization (HMO)</u>—An entity that provides, offers, or arranges for coverage of designated health services needed by plan members for a fixed, prepaid premium.
- <u>Health Plan</u>—The set of services in an insurance policy for health care.
- <u>Health Plan Employer Data and Information Set</u>—A standardized report used to compare and evaluate HMO's.

#### 1111...

- Independent Living Skills—Basic skills needed to successfully function to the greatest extent possible, in the least restrictive environment.
- <u>Individualized Transition Plan (ITP)</u>—A plan which includes long-term goals and short-term objectives, including: a) timelines, b) measurable expected outcomes, and c) identification of persons who are responsible for teaching and monitoring the plan to ensure that the goals and objectives are met.

Inpatient—A patient who stays in a hospital overnight.

Integrated Work Setting—Work setting where duties are performed with opportunity for work and non-work interaction with workers who are not disabled. Ratio of non-disabled to disabled workers is no higher than eight-to-one. **J J J J** ...

<u>Job Analysis</u>—Job analysis identifies and describes: a) what the worker does; b) how the work is done; c) results of the work; and d) the worker's characteristics.

<u>Job Coach</u>—Provides individualized one-to-one assistance in job placement, travel training, skill training at the job site, ongoing assessments, and long-term assessment.

<u>Job Development Specialist</u>—An individual who contacts businesses and industries for the purpose of placing individuals in competitive employment or on-the-job training sites.

#### L L L L ...

<u>Lifetime Maximum</u>—The total amount that an insurance policy will pay out for medical care during the lifetime of a policy holder.

#### МММм...

<u>Managed Care</u>—A term used to describe strategies of health-care plans to control costs by monitoring services and providers used for fees charged.

<u>Maximum Out-of-Pocket Cost</u>—The maximum amount of money a member will have to pay from his or her own funds for deductibles, copayments, or other expenses.

<u>Medically Necessary</u>—Services required to prevent harm to the patient or to the patient's quality of life.

#### N N N N ...

<u>Non-Participating Provider</u>—A provider who isn't part of a specific health plan.

#### 0000...

<u>Outcome Oriented</u>—A measurable skill at the end of a set period of training.

#### РРР....

Placement Specialist—Professional who assists in job placement.

<u>Pre-Admission Review</u>—A review undertaken by a health plan that happens before a patient enters a hospital to determine if the admission is necessary and appropriate.

<u>Pre-Certification</u>—Similar to pre-admission review but requires a certificate or authorization from the patient's health plan.

<u>Pre-Existing Condition</u>—A health condition that a person has that an insurance policy specifically excludes from coverage or that prevents the person from qualifying for insurance.

<u>Preventive Care</u>—Health care that stresses healthy behavior, regular testing, screening for diseases, and other services that detect diseases early or or prevents them from occurring.

<u>Primary Care</u>—First-level or generalist care that a person receives outside a hospital.

Primary Care Physician (PCP)—The health-care provider a person

most commonly calls first when a problem arises.

<u>Prior Authorization</u>—A cost-control procedure in which an insurer requires a service or medication to be approved in advance for coverage.

Provider—A person or an institution that delivers a service.

#### R R R R ...

<u>Referral</u>—When one health-care provider suggests you visit another one for the purpose of further evaluation and treatment.

#### SSSs...

<u>Screening Test</u>—A procedure to determine if a person has a certain medical condition.

<u>Secondary Care</u>—Care, often provided in hospitals and long-term facilities, that makes more use of caregivers with specialized training than does primary care.

<u>Self-Referral</u>—When a health-care provider stands to benefit financially from referring a patient to another provider for care.

<u>Service Area</u>—The geographic area a health plan serves.

<u>Sheltered Workshop</u>—Provides transitional and/or long-term employment in a controlled and closed working environment. It may provide vocational evaluation, work adjustment, and supported employment service.

<u>Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI)</u>—benefits provided to disabled and blind individuals who are " insured" by workers' contributions to the Social Security Trust. The worker's widower or worker's adult child with a disability may also receive a benefit.

<u>Specialist</u>—A physician whose training focuses on a particular area beyond the general training for all physicians.

- <u>Supported Employment</u>—Paid employment for individuals with severe disabilities. All supported employment programs take place in integrated settings with on-going job site support provided by professional staff in integrated community based employment setting.
- <u>Supplemental Security Income (SSI)</u>—cash assistance program to aged, blind and individuals with disabilities including children under 18 who have limited income and resources.

#### ТТТт...

<u>Task Analysis (TA)</u>—The breakdown of a particular job into its component work activities.

<u>Tertiary Care</u>—Highly specialized care for severe health problems.

#### **U U U** U ...

<u>Utilization Management</u>—The process health plans and insurers use to make sure the kind of treatment and care recommended for a patient is necessary and appropriate. Thank You . . .
