



open water - ponds, reservoirs, and river

open meadow

1A category 1 wetland- high quality wetland; wetland emergent; large Western Red Cedars; perennial streams; areas near entry are wet meadow and not high quality nor same category

1B - defined by old logging road at north edge; seep wetlands along north slope with a couple of riparian corridors; hydrology along existing roadbed needs improvement

2 - second growth forest - approximately 20-30 years old; primarily Douglas Fir with smaller amounts of Cedar, Hemlock; Madrones on south slopes; shade tolerant species with good native shrub diversity

 3 - forested wetland - higher up hillside; high quality Western Red Cedars with larger, unloggged trees

4 - heavily logged area (recent); primarily Scotch Broom; very sandy soils; no evidence that this area was ever wetland

5 - seep wetlands - indicated by some of the largest trees; seep wetlands on steep slopes near western edge of property

6 - upland - heavily wooded, lots of Salal, Sword Fern, Indian Plum, Salmonberry; very dry, no evidence of flowing water

7 - mixed forest - dominated by deciduous trees; Big Leaf Maple, Alder; Salmonberry, Red Elderberry, and Red Huckleberry; becomes more dry adapted as the slope is climbed
