The Kitsap County Commission on Children and Youth meeting was held on Thursday, April 6, 2017 4:30 p.m. at Olympic Educational Service District 114 in Bremerton. Ursula Petters facilitated this meeting and called the meeting to order.

I. INTRODUCTIONS

Ursula asked members and guests for self-introductions.

II. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES/AMENDMENTS TO THE AGENDA

The Youth Commission's March 2, 2017 meeting minutes were reviewed and unable to be approved due to lack of quorum. They were accepted by consensus.

III. PRESENTATION

Joshua Goss of the Coffee Oasis presented on their new program: the Oasis Youth Line. The Oasis Youth Line is part of the Crisis Intervention Program. It provides effective and compassionate support for youth (13-25) in crisis.

It is spring break and there were no youth present at the meeting.

VI. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Comment was offered regarding the wonderful experience had by members who attended the KCHP Summit and the reception held by Graduate Kitsap. Meilana Charles Director of the WSU Extension was in attendance and shared information about the Strengthening Families Program.

Laura shared the article from the Kitsap Sun that highlighted the improvement to the data measured annually regarding youth substance use. Many of the indicators have improved and there is still work to be done around perception of harm as well as other indicators.

There is a Bike Rodeo focusing on children and safety happening in North Kitsap. 4/27 9-12, at the Poulsbo Library and 5/7 1-4 at the Village Green Community Center in Kingston.
